CASE Notes: School Counseling

Mrs. Kirkland and Mrs. Swenson have been talking about skills for learning this month, such as listening skills, respect, empathy, and planning skills. Students have been learning and practicing essential skills they need to become a good student and friend to others. One idea discussed often is Empathy, or "walk a mile in someone else's shoes."

Activity idea— swap shoes with your child, tell them of a time in your life that you were challenged, and how you overcame that challenge.

Art is JOY!

Our first grade artists are working on self-portraits! We practiced making drawings of characters and then of ourselves. Students wanted to make their portrait have the same features and characteristics that they do by looking in large mirrors. We discussed that we have things in common and things that are different and how we could include those details. Coach's Corner: Jenny Durham

The PK-5 leadership team is represented by two Administrators, one Instructional Coach, and eight Teacher Leaders. The teacher leadership vision supports the Centerville School District's mission statement, "All students will learn well, become lifelong learners, and contribute positively to society." This team meets monthly to support district initiatives with the goal of improving student achievement. During these meetings, we plan on how we will facilitate our collaborative groups and academic discussions with the rest of our teams. We analyze data and focus on a systematic approach in the areas of academic, behavioral, and social-emotional support to all students.

During the 2024-2025 school year, K- 5 teachers are engaging in a professional learning course of study based in the science of reading. This training course is called Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling, commonly known as LETRS. LETRS instructs teachers in what literacy skills need to be taught, why, and how to plan to teach them. This professional-learning program delves into the research-based recommendations to improve student literacy.
